Hugh Beattie and Peter Dean 07.07.21 - 27.07.21

We have an exciting exhibition of work by renowned military artist Hugh Beattie coming to the Centre from 7th to 27 July. The exhibition will include Hugh's North Essex Collection and unveiling new works in oil. Hugh is a traditional oil painter, illustrator and futurist specializing in portraits, landscapes and a wide range of figurative work. He is the only official oil painter in the British army, serving as a reservist Captain. Hugh has travelled globally on painting tours, in places as diverse as Bosnia, Rome, India Helmand and Estonia. He has won prizes for his military work and in between commissions, he also focuses on north Essex where he has a studio and immerses himself in the art community of the area.



Joining Hugh during his exhibition will be Peter Deans, our local ceramic artist, a member of the Essex Craft Guild and a selected member of Anglian Potters. He has exhibited at Cambridge Emmanuel College, All Saints Church and the Undercroft in Norwich. Peter can also be found at craft fayres when they start up again. Peter holds a National Diploma and Higher National Diploma in Ceramics. His work includes experiments with glazes layered over another and creating pebble shaped vases throwing different coloured clays together and experimenting with porcelain and crank clay. Peter's exhibition will feature class hand thrown ceramics and new seashore forms.



Threadworks 28.07.21 - 14.08.21






Material Girls 18.08.21 - 04.09.21

The Material Girls hope visitors to the exhibition will enjoy leaving their troubles at the door and step into 'The Enchanted Garden'.




Thames Sailing Barge Trust 08.09.21 - 28.09.21

The exhibition will focus on the cargoes they carried and the people who built and operated them.

The exhibition is funded by the Heritage Lottery and is part of The Pudge Project which is restoring the sailing barge Pudge in Maldon. Pudge was a Dunkirk Little Ship, and built in 1922 by the London and Rochester Barge Co. in Kent.

Entrance to the exhibition is free and the Maeldune Heritage Centre is open from 11:00 – 16:00, Tuesday to Saturday.

Gill and Edd Mitcham were due to exhibit with us in March 2020 and his exhibition was ready to go when we went into lockdown and has to close the Centre. Sadly Ed passed away in Spring this year. Gill will be celebrating her late husband's work as an artist. Edd Mitcham was an artist painting mainly in oil on canvas board. He was a keen east coast yachtsman for many years and his main subject

is marine art although he sometimes branched out into figure work and landscape. For some years Gill and Edd cruised the Chelmer and Blackwater canal in their narrowboat, where Edd developed his own style of narrowboat art. Samples of Edd's work are below.

Talks on the Maldon Embroidery will be available on request. Also new to the Centre this year we have:

- 1. A life size figure of Bryhtnoth to demonstrate how tall he was in battle and for visitors to take photos.
- A Battle of Maldon Project pack. The main part of the pack is a Teachers' resource pack consisting of maps and information sheets. The second pack of sheets are Pupil Activity Sheets on various aspects of Saxon and Viking life.

The pack has been updated from the original Millennium pack by Jill Hipsey. That pack and this updated version were compiled by local teachers and originally financed by D. Ketley Asphalts. This updated version has been verified by Keith Bannister, retired local headteacher, who was involved in compiling the original pack. This is not intended to be a definitive programme of study and can be looked upon more as resource pack to aid

good primary practice. However, the National Curriculum History programmes of study for KS2 have been linked as far as possible.
